WORSHIP THROUGH OUR COMMON CONFESSION OF THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

"None of God's people, before or after the cross, would be accepted by an immaculately holy God if the prefect righteousness of Christ were not imputed to us. But that does not mean that God does not produce in those "justified" people (before and after the cross) an experiential righteousness... In fact, he does; and this righteousness is precious to God and is required, not as the ground of our justification (which is the righteousness of Christ only), but as an evidence of our being truly justified children of God (John Piper, Future Grace, 151)."
